


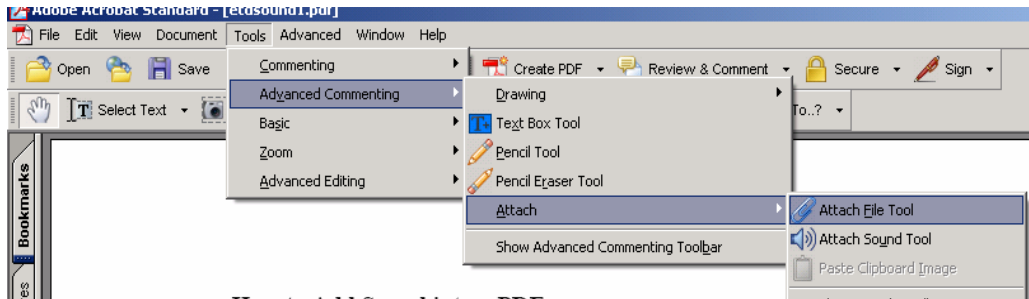
## How to Add Video Files into a PDF (Portable Document Format) File Adobe Acrobat 6.0

Follow the directions below to add a video (also called a movie) file into a PDF document using the Attach File tool.

- Remember, video files are embedded into the PDF document, which will increase the PDF's file size by the amount of the added video file. This is important to remember because movie files are often quite large.
- The video does not need to be in any specific format in order to be compatible with Acrobat, but the person viewing the PDF must also have appropriate playback software (e.g. Quicktime player is needed to view .mov video files)

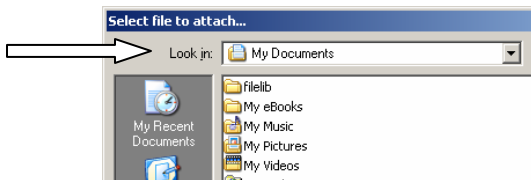
1. Open your document inside Adobe Acrobat and browse to the page where you would like to place the video.

2. Click on the  Attach File tool which can be found on the Tools and Advanced Commenting menus.

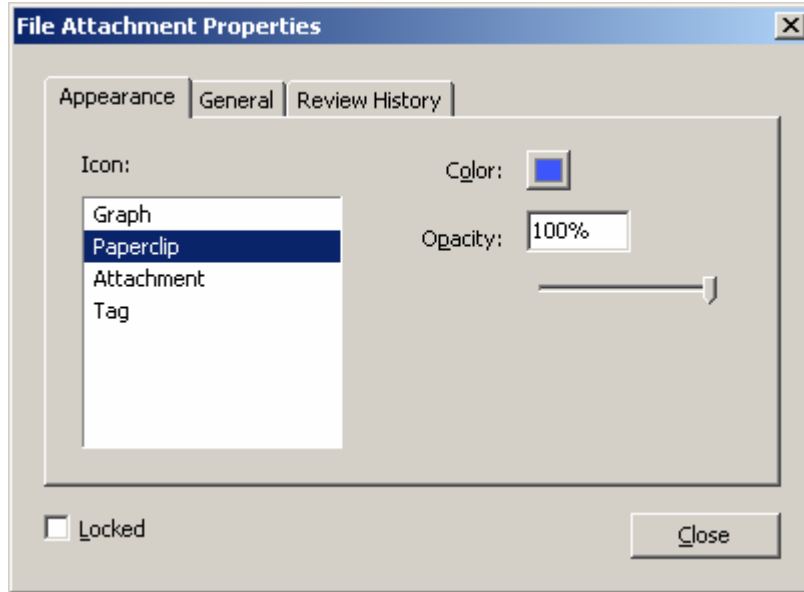


3. The mouse pointer will turn into a pin icon, click on the area of the document where the link icon to the video file is desired.

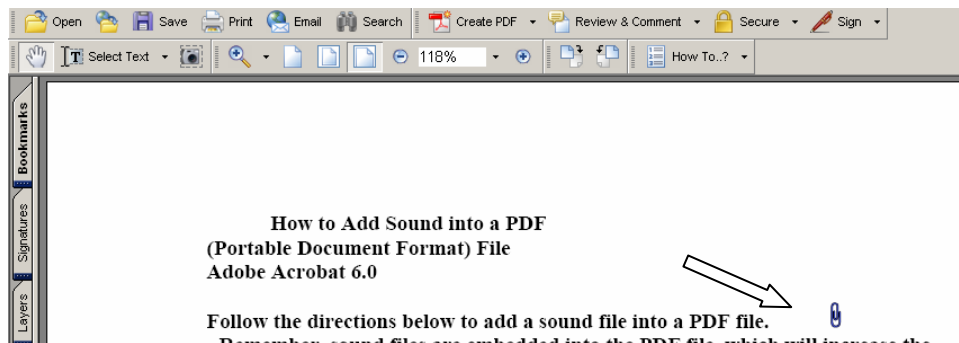
4. An explorer window will appear, use the “Look in:” drop-down box to browse to the place where the desired video is located. Click on the desired video file and then click “Select”.




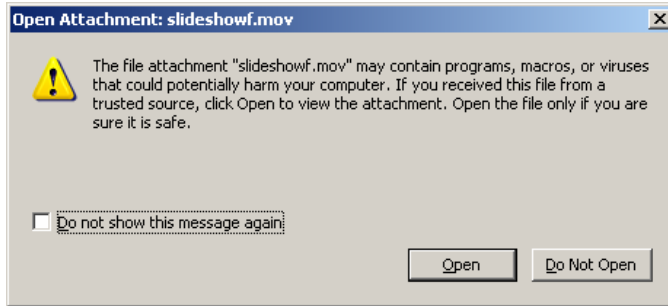
5. A new window will appear, prompting to choose an icon that will represent the link to the video file within the document. Select the desired icon from the list and click Close.



6. The icon (in this case a paperclip) will then appear in the document.



7. Use the Hand Tool  to test the file. A warning similar to the dialog box below may appear. Click Open to open the linked video file.



8. To delete the link, simply right-click on icon representing the link (in this case a paperclip, chosen in step 5) and choose the Delete option from the menu that appears.
