## Introduction

Records of the Miami Valley Personnel and Guidance Association were accessioned into the Wright State University Department of Archives and Special Collections on January 6, 1987. They were donated by David Berglund, an officer of the organization.

The papers in this collection date from 1967-1987 and fill 1 Hollinger box and 7 file folders. The collection is arranged into seven series as follows:

- Series 1: Constitutions
- Series 2: Minutes
- Series 3: Membership Lists
- Series 4: Newsletters
- Series 5: Pamphlets
- Series 6: Correspondence
- Series 7: Award

There are no restrictions on the use of these records.

### Brief Biographical Sketch

The Miami Valley Personnel and Guidance Association (MVPGA) was founded in 1967 by a group of Personnel and Guidance counselors from the Dayton, Ohio area concerned with supporting and promoting the ideals of their profession.

MVPGA sponsored training seminars for its members enrichment and legislation promoting and recognizing their profession on the state and national level.

They achieved the Outstanding Chapter Award for 1979-80 of the Ohio Personnel and Guidance Association.

## Scope and Content

The records contained within this collection, spanning the years 1967-1987, provide an excellent source of material concerning the beginnings of the organization, the professional enrichment from within the organization, and their quest for recognition of their profession on the state and national level.

The organizations constitutions, by-laws, and revisions between 1967 and 1987 are contained in Series 1.

Series 2 and 3 consists of the Minutes of the regular and executive committee sessions from 1974-1986, and the membership lists from 1974-1986.

The MVPGA Newsletters from Vol. I #I Winter 1975 through Vol. XII #III Spring 1986 are contained within Series 4.

Training seminars and educational pamphlets of the organization from 1971-1986 which offer an insight into the problems concerning the profession are contained in Series 5.

Series 6 contains correspondence between the organization, its members, legislators, and noted professionals within the field between 1977 and 1986.

The Ohio Personnel and Guidance Associations Outstanding Chapter Award for 1979-80 received by the MVPGA is contained within Series 7.

All the materials in this collection are arranged chronologically within each file folder.
